He showed his loyalty to the Sahib of the company by making a present of his handwork to him. One fine day Singh received a registered letter. He was afraid that this might be the news of stoppage of his pension. The letter worried him and drove him mad.

One day the police arrested him for breaking streetlights. Even at that time, he had not opened the letter. On the way to the police station, the accountant of the company met him by chance. He told Singh about the content of the letter. It was Sahib's commendation of his artistic models with a reward of rupees hundred. The accountant tore to open the letter and gave him the cheque. The accountant secured the release of Singh. Thereafter Singh never made toys again. This story reveals the gateman as an unforgettable character. His simplicity and loyalty, his pride, his blameless career, his gift of making toys, his misfortune and his deliverance are brought out in this short story.
